

Getting to and from The 2014 Ryder Cup

In order to make everyone's journey as smooth and safe as possible, we recommend the following ways to get to The 2014 Ryder Cup:

GENERAL

- All public car parking is located at one of the three Park and Ride sites: EAST Park and Ride (Balado, Kinross), NORTH Park and Ride (McDiarmid Park, Perth) and WEST Park and Ride (Castleview, Stirling).
- There is no direct public pedestrian access or egress to The Gleneagles site so ticket holding spectators should note they cannot be dropped off or picked up near the venue for arrival or departure.
- Please allow plenty of time for travel and arrive early. Please include time for journeys to the Park and Ride sites and then to /from The Ryder Cup Bus Terminals, both on arrival and departure.

Ticket and security checkpoints will be in place at the Park and Rides so please also allow appropriate time in your schedule for these elements and then the transfer journey via the Park and Ride.

- Please refer to the section on Prohibited Items in the Spectator A-Z guide and avoid bringing any of these items to the event.
- There will be a left luggage facility.
- "No Parking/Tow away" zones are in place on all roads around The Gleneagles Hotel and any unattended vehicle will be removed.
- Private vehicles will NOT be permitted access to the site.
- All tickets are for nominated ticket holders with no ticket sales on the gate and spectators will not be permitted to leave the event main site and return to it on the same day (i.e. No Pass-Outs).
- When spectators leave The Gleneagles site they must return via the same route as they gained access (e.g to their respective Park and Ride site, bus terminal or rail station).
- Whilst all times and distances are given for normal traffic conditions, due to traffic flow conditions during the event, journey times may increase and different routes may need to be taken.

BY CAR

A Park and Ride scheme is being implemented to relieve as much pressure as possible on the road infrastructure, and to ensure a smooth and safe

journey to The 2014 Ryder Cup.

EAST Park and Ride (Balado, Kinross), NORTH Park and Ride (McDiarmid Park, Perth) and WEST Park and Ride (Castleview, Stirling) have been selected as the three official Park and Ride locations for The 2014 Ryder Cup. There is NO public parking facility or drop off points at or near The Gleneagles Hotel other than for essential event personnel. Roads in the immediate vicinity of the venue are closed to unauthorised vehicles and private cars. *Operating Times*

All three Car Parks will be open for parking to enable spectators to arrive in time for first tee off at Gleneagles. The last bus to the Park and Ride car parks will leave at approximately 2100 hours and the Park and Ride car parks will close at 2200 hours.

Please allow plenty of time for journeys to/from The Ryder Cup Bus Terminals and the three Park and Ride locations both on arrival and departure.

Travelling to East Park and Ride (Balado, Kinross)

Located approximately 15 miles to the south east of Gleneagles. It is situated on the south side of the A91, just off the M90 motorway and is designed to service all event traffic travelling from Edinburgh and the east of Scotland. Ticket and security checkpoints will be in place at the Park and Rides. Please allow appropriate time in your schedule for these elements and then the transfer journey via the Park and Ride.

Under normal traffic conditions, the transfer time from EAST Park and Ride (Balado, Kinross) to The Ryder Cup Public Bus Terminal is approximately 25 minutes.

Travelling to North Park and Ride (McDiarmid Park, Perth)

Located approximately 16 miles to the north east of Gleneagles. It is situated on the north side of the A85, just off the A9 and is designed to service all event traffic travelling from Perth and the north east of Scotland. Ticket and security checkpoints will be in place at the Park and Rides. Please allow appropriate time in your schedule for these elements and then the transfer journey via the Park and Ride.

Under normal traffic conditions, the transfer time from NORTH Park and Ride (McDiarmid Park, Perth) to The Ryder Cup Public Bus Terminal is approximately 20 minutes.

Travelling to West Park and Ride (Castleview, Stirling)

Located approximately 19 miles to the south west of Gleneagles. It is situated off the M9 motorway, between junction 9 and 10 and is designed to service all event traffic travelling from Glasgow, Stirling and the west of Scotland. Ticket and security checkpoints will be in place at the Park and Rides. Please allow appropriate time in your schedule for these elements and then the transfer journey via the Park and Ride.

Under normal traffic conditions, the transfer time from WEST Park and Ride (Castleview, Stirling) to The Ryder Cup Public Bus Terminal is approximately 25 minutes.

Car Parking Fees

Please note that spectators intending to use the Park and Ride site locations will need to purchase their car parking in advance of the event. The can be purchased at the same time as your tickets, alternatively you can buy them from www.rydercup.com/europe/tickets or on 0844 854 2013.

Your car park pass must be displayed at all times. Ryder Cup Europe LLP

reserves the right to charge the appropriate daily car parking rate for any guest not displaying a valid car park pass.

Parking fees at all three Park and Ride sites are £10 per vehicle per day on Tuesday and Wednesday, £20 per vehicle per day from Thursday to Sunday. Price includes VAT.

Private Limousine Hire/Taxis

Private Hire vehicles, private buses/coaches, limousines and taxis will NOT be allowed access to The 2014 Ryder Cup event site nor is there any facility for drop off or pick up on adjoining routes or pedestrian access or egress to the event site. Private Hire, private buses/coaches, limousines and taxis should follow the Park and Ride event signage to the most appropriate Park and Ride site where there will be a dedicated drop off and collection area.

BY RAIL

ScotRail will be providing dedicated trains to transport spectators to and from Gleneagles Station. The Station is only a short walk from the entrance to The 2014 Ryder Cup.

Dedicated early morning and late evening services will run to/from Gleneagles station from Edinburgh, Glasgow, Inverness, Aberdeen and Perth. Trains may also call at Aviemore, Pitlochry, Dunkeld, Carnoustie, Arbroath, Montrose and Dundee depending on advance demand.

As this is a normal working week for commuters across Scotland, you will appreciate that the number of trains available as Ryder Cup 'specials' is limited, however we have made every effort to ensure that as much space as possible has been made available to spectators.

Rail tickets will be able to be pre-booked from September 2013. However if you are intending to travel by train you will be asked to indicate this preference when applying for Ryder Cup tickets. In addition, you will be asked to indicate which station you would prefer to travel from.

All spectators who tick train travel as a preference will be emailed in September 2013 and invited to purchase their train travel online.

BY BUS

There will be scheduled bus services from the centre of Glasgow and Edinburgh to The Ryder Cup 2014 Bus Terminals. These must be booked in advance and full details of times and costs will be released in September 2013 when they will be available for sale.

BY HELICOPTER

The Official Helicopter landing site will be located very near to The 2014 Ryder Cup site. All landings are by prior arrangement only. Full details will be published at a later date.

DISABLED PARKING/TRANSPORT

Designated disabled parking is located at the event site and is issued with the Disabled Ground Entry pass, for wheelchair users and other mobility issues. Spectators who require a disabled parking pass/access to the course should contact Charlotte Banks: cbanks@europeantour.com

Those who have a blue disabled badge but no disabled ground entry pass will park in dedicated areas at the front of the Park and Ride car parks. Should assistance be required on site please contact the nearest marshal.

TICKET AND SECURITY PROCESS (ALL SITES)

The ticket and security checking process will be completed as quickly as possible, however it may take some time and involve queuing - particularly at

peak periods. Please allow sufficient time for this element in planning your journey times. Please note that there will be prohibited items that will NOT be permitted onto the site, details of which can be found in the Spectator A-Z section.
